Editorial

Electoral survival

In a tea garden on the banks of the Neora river, we spoke to a group of Muslim men at a bazaar. It is a visibly syncretic space, with Rajbanshis, Adivasis, and Bengali-speaking Muslims interacting with one another alongside a masjid and a mandir that stand side by side. But the Muslim men tell me only they were 'targeted' in the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls; the polling booths in Muslim areas have seen more than 20% of voters being deleted. These remarks are consistent with what we have been hearing across the state about the SIR that was meant to clean up the electoral rolls. It is the latest in a series of narratives and policies that have harassed the Muslim community and threatened their citizenship and electoral representation in India, but this feels more personal. People are being struck off of the rolls because of who they are; families are being split, with only some members making it to the list. The State seems to be deciding who is and is not eligible for voting not based on lineage or religion but based on how it reads paper documents. The political theorist, Robert Dahl, famously characterised political systems along two axes - contestation and inclusivity. Contestation means that all political formations and social interests are able to compete for power on an equal footing. Inclusion implies each citizen is given equal weight in expressing his/her preference among the options available. The most democratic system is understood to be the one that offers the highest levels of contestation and inclusivity. In this piece, I seek to historicise the principles of contestation and inclusivity with respect to West Bengal's Muslim community. A natural historical starting point to understand the patterns of Muslim representation in Bengal would be the Partition of Bengal into two regions, West Bengal in India and East Pakistan (later to become Bangladesh).

Aabid Surti - The 90-Year-Old Saving Tonnes of Water, One Drop at a Time

Aabid Surti is a 90-year-old author, painter, and cartoonist from Mumbai who is widely known as a "Water

Warrior." Born on May 5, 1935, in Vavera village, Gujarat, he grew up on the pavements of Dongri where water scarcity was so severe that he saw people fighting for every bucket. That childhood experience stayed with him and became the driving force behind his mission. In 2007, after reading that a tap leaking one drop per second wastes 1,000 litres a month, he started the Drop Dead Foundation, a one-man NGO with the tagline "Save every drop or drop dead." Every Sunday, Aabid goes door-to-door in Mumbai's suburbs with a plumber and a bag of rubber gaskets, fixing leaking taps for free. Through this simple effort he has saved over 20 million litres of water across thousands of households. A

National Award-winning writer of 80+ books and the creator of the iconic comic hero Bahadur, Aabid proves that one person's commitment can conserve tonnes of water. Its tagline goes to say - "save every drop, or drop dead." The response to Drop Dead has been unbelievable. It's picking up fast like jungle fire, not only in India but all over the globe. Aabid, as the very name suggests, was born into a Muslim family in Gujarat. His father is a follower of Sufism but his mother tongue is Gujarati. Having obtained a diploma from J.J School of Art, Aabid began his journey as a freelancer. If we mix it all together, we get India's very own legendary hero, the Jack of all trades. He has 80 books to his credit. His childhood years were spent in a chawl and on pavement. To get a bucket full of water from the common tap, his mother had to stand in the queue early in the morning and often she had to fight for her right. This childhood memory kept on haunting him whenever he saw a leaking tap, overflowing building tank, or bursting pipeline. On every Sunday

morning he visits the topmost floor of his apartment complex in Mumbai's Mira Road district. He rings the doorbells of all 56 apartments in the complex, asking residents a simple question: "Do you have a leaking tap in your home?" Aabid is accompanied by a plumber and a volunteer. The plumber gets to work, plugging leaks in the homes of those who answer with a yes. Aabid apologises to those who say no. Over the years, Aabid says, his efforts have helped save 10 million litres of water - and also won him fans and followers. Water is known as the elixir of life. Therefore, water conservation is necessary to save lives. Save water, save life Water is necessary for life. Water is needed for domestic, agricultural and industrial purposes. Water needs to be conserved for generations to come. A man with this motto started his journey of saving one tap at a time. The spirit of the work that Aabid is doing today is what has infused his work throughout his artistic career. He hired a plumber and started going around fixing leaking faucets in people's

homes free of cost. According to the statistics, it is found that only 1% of total water is left which is useful for human kind and 98.5% is available in sea which is salted water and not worth for existence of life. About 71% area of earth is covered by water which is also referred as Hydrosphere of earth, in which 96.5% water is found in seas or oceans which are salted water and not useful for anyone. Also 1.7% is in ground water, 1.7% in glaciers and 0.001% in the air in form of vapour or clouds. 2.5% of total water on earth is fresh water in which 98.8% is ice and ground water; thus, only around 1% is found as potable water. By seeing this calculation we can imagine that how much water is available which is useful for us. The modern-day Jal Rakshak, Aabid is saving the country, one drop at a time. Aabid currently resides in Mumbai and very well understands how precious

water is, having coped with water shortages himself. Since the time when that leaking faucet bothered him so much, Aabid has not stopped. In the first year of the Foundation's existence, in 2007, he had visited ,1666 houses on Mira Road, fixed 414 leaking taps free of charge, and saved about 4.14 lakh litres of water. In this current situation, when a less amount of fresh water is left on earth, we are still careless about the misuse of water, which is completely wrong in all way. We are continuously wasting this precious nature's gift by doing some bad and objectionable acts. It is to be remembered that thousands have lived without love, not one without water. Folk singer Kajal Mehria's brother has posted a post seeking help from community leaders claiming that she had entered into a love marriage without the knowledge of her family. On Sunday, when Kajal Mehria's family and leaders of the Mehria community reached Kajal's in-laws' house in Shertha, Gandhinagar, the police were on the run. Later, the community leaders reached Adalaj police station. Where they inquired about Kajal Mehria's marriage. Kajal showed her readiness to present her marriage certificate. Kajal's family members reached Shertha village with community leaders. Gujarat's famous folk singer Kajal Mehria is in the news for her high voltage drama of her marriage.
